

## CENTRAL FLA. BOX HOSTS OPEN HOUSE

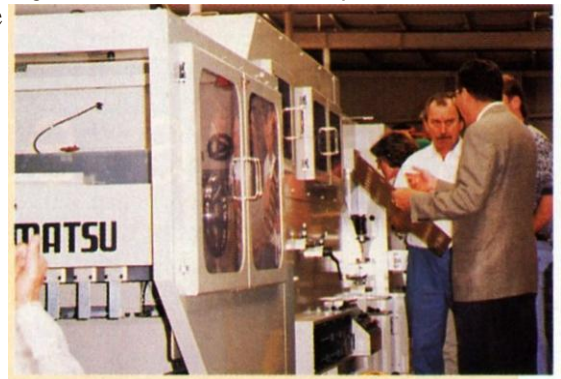
ORLANDO, FLA.—Corrugated converters attending the spring AICC meeting here in April spent an afternoon at Central Florida Box Corp. to get a closer look at two newly-installed pieces of machinery — a Tecasa 66-by-141-inch two-color flexo folder-gluer with fully-automatic computerized controls and a Marumatsu SuperMax flatbed diecutter that can cut and strip with a single die from Hitek Equipment.

The Tecasa flexo folder-gluer is the first installation of this size in the United States, according to Joseph Burke of Tecasa USA Inc. A modem keeps the machine networked to Tecasa's parent company in Spain for troubleshooting.

The 43,000-square-foot sheet plant runs a mix of products from stock boxes to RSCs, point-of-purchase displays and some litho laminating work, says Ed Rivera of Central Florida Box. The plant produces about six million square feet of board a month. Rivera and Tom Ramsey, of Central Florida Box, along with Burke and Keith Reiter of Hitek Equipment were on-hand during the open house and plant tour to answer questions.
